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CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY: A BRIEF INTRODUCTION FOREWORD

The prime goal of the Children's University is to shape and inculcate the tradition of divine human beings and in order to achieve this loftiest dream the frame of work area is wide and encompassing covering the studies from prenatal care to teen age; along with the related areas to this broad span. The main pillars are its four synchronically well linked centers i.e. Research, Education, Training and Extension. Among them, the Centre of Research is its core stone wherein various researches and programs are being carried out in order to inspire young scholarly minds and academicians for quality researches related to the Children's Studies.

In addition it provides a research based instructions to the centre of education to mould and modify different curricula of multiplicity of disciplines need to be framed for the ultra-modern requirements of the child related areas. The Centre of Education is adamant to attempt diligently to initiate various courses in relation to the research frame provide by the centre of research. The university has centre of training to satiate the demands of modern pedagogy and teaching methodology centred upon the child development. The centre of extensions services is the fourth pillar that channelizes and disseminates the researches and novel programs to all strata of the society.

INCEPTION OF UNIVERSITY:

The global tradition of academia has no particular institution that could cover a wide range of the children related studies. This domain of sheer avoidance was first torched light upon by Shri Narendra Modi the then Chief Minister and present Prime Minister of India. However it was Prof. Kiritbhai Joshi who moulded and elaborated this idea to the height of the institution. This concept is about to enter in its mature phase and is prepared to counter the challenges that fall under this field which are as follows:

- To build the human future of the Nation basing the ideals of the antiquity and provide the knowledge of modernity in order to shape the divinely inspired children.

- To make the generations to come understand the value of interdependence that is the core of Indian modern antiquity;
- To lay the emphasis on divergent thinking and provide them atmosphere to think critically and creatively;

- To generate novel paradigms of job opportunities for the students
- To inspire researches that may pave the way to the global acknowledgement of *Bharatiya* philosophy.

THE VISION OF THE CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY:

- The children of today have to be prepared to become builders of the future, the future which would be marked by the alternative of competitive individualism by availing to them the synthesis of individual liberty, collective egalitarianism and universal and spiritual fraternity;
- The future will be liberated from disabling skepticism and from comforting arrestation of quest of knowledge, and progress will be accelerated by ardent aspirations to realize higher spiritual truths and their manifestation in physical life;
- The new world of the future will also cultivate material life so as to make it prosperous and rich and it will replace poverty wherever it exists by the elimination of drudgery, exploitation and slavery and encourage nobility, dignity and continuous empowerment.
- The Children's University will lead the children of today to build a new world of friendliness, mutual respect and harmony that transcends all the barriers of narrow-mindedness and blind conflicts resulting from exclusivism and burden of the past that strives to linger against the pressure of the future of uplifting light and prosperity.

MISSION

The mission of the Children's University will be to undertake vast areas of researches falling under the purview of the children's studies and then after to employ the results of them into the making of an effective three fold program in the state of Gujarat i.e., :

- Every child matters;
- Integral development of the child that unites scientific realism and aesthetic creativity by availing the synthesis of science and spirituality;
- Synthesis of the East and the West, of the ancient and the modern, by means of intense studies of the lessons of history directed towards the task of building a new world of knowledge, freedom and prosperity that are denied to none.

OBJECTIVES

- Objectives of the University would be formulated in the light of the guidance visible in the modern *Darshans* of Maharshi Dayananda Saraswati, Swami Vivekananda, Mahatma Gandhi, Rabindranath Tagore, and Sri Aurobindo and many other pioneering educationists and thinkers of India and the world;
- Ideal of nationalism in harmony with the ideal of internationalism;

- Education of the body, vital consciousness, mind as also psychic consciousness and spirituality should be placed in the focus of the research and educational activities of the University;
- Education should not only impart knowledge but should also inspire character and cultural values;
- Scientific realism and artistic creativity should be synthesized during the course of the education of the child;
- The Children's University will impart education on the four pillars of modern times those are : Learning to know, learning to do, learning to live together and learning to be;
- Education for life and for the journey of life that would include the harmonious growth of the individual, family, society and the world, with special emphasis on the ideal of social service;
- Expansion of ancient wisdom in the light of modern developments and research;
- Education of the child should aim at the development of sterling character filled with patriotism and dedicated to self - reliance and dignity of labour and harmonious development of the body, life, mind and spirit, capable of meeting successfully the challenges of contemporary times and capable of molding the commitment to our country and the highest values of culture, as also to Fundamental Duties enumerated under Article 51A of the Constitution of India;
- Establishment of facilities, programs and activities that would promote at all levels of education concerns for the development of the child, in particular reference to:
 - Harmonious growth of health, strength, agility and health of the body mind and spirit;
 - Qualities of quest for the truth and knowledge, courage, heroism, adventure, enterprise, initiative, enthusiasm and dynamism of active life;
 - Qualities of sympathy, friendliness, fairness, justice, patriotism and universal welfare in all its aspects;
 - Qualities of multiple skills and applied technology; and
 - Qualities of unity, mutuality and harmony that spring from the deepest psychic and spiritual recesses and which can be nurtured by the processes of learning to be and to become.

DISTINCT NATURE AND FEATURES OF THE CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY

The Children's University is unique in many ways from the conventional university set up. The University covers very wide area of stakeholders concerning with the child's holistic development. The University's foundation lies on the spiritual base. The organizational structure of the University is also different to fulfil the unique functions of the University. The functions of the University are distributed in very wide spectrum of disciplines which includes philosophy, sociology, psychology, languages & literature(s), education, technology, medical sciences etc. The University concerns with the holistic development of the child. For the accomplishment of this maverick goal, the University has encompassed a wide spectrum of child's growth and development. Some of the distinct features of the university are as follows.

- 1. The University includes the holistic development of every child beginning from the mother's womb to adulthood whereas conventional universities mainly focus on the higher education after the completion of school education.
- 2. All stakeholders concerned with the all round development of children are also included in the area of the University i.e., children, parents, family, educational innovators, educational leaders, teachers of all levels, various communities, policy makers, government officers etc.
- 3. The University is aimed at transforming the prevailing educational system. This paradigm shift will take place through research, education, training and extension services. The child centric research is much neglected area within the higher education fraternity. The University is adamant to fill this gap.
- 4. The University primarily focuses on the synthesis of ancient Indian wisdom and modern scientific knowledge. The University will work for rejuvenating the essential values in all walks of life.
- 5. The University will contribute to the field of child development on the basis of researches guided by various research-councils of the Center of Research.
- 6. The University shall have the Director General whose functions are laid down in the Act. The Director General will play the pivotal role for the realization of the mission of the University.
- 7. The University will provide research fellowships to the upcoming researchers to promote child centric researches. The scheme of research fellowships to novel researches is the key feature of the University.

UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

The Children's University operates itself under the four dimensions, i.e. Research, Education, Training and Extension. The university stands on the foundation of research. On the basis of researches undertaken by this center, other centers also work and plan for the development of the university. The present chapter gives detailed information about the core design of the university and its four centers. Each center adheres to the goals pertaining to the wider realms of children's studies and child development. The brief information regarding the purposes and prime areas of various centers are as follows.

CENTER OF RESEARCH

The Center of Research is the core center of the Children's University. The prime motif behind establishing this center is to generate various researches adhering to the Children's Studies wherein the goals will remain stick to the confluence of the antiquity and modernity. The main areas of the focus are:

- Prenatal education to the parents
- Prenatal care and education for pregnant women
- Issues relating to child birth
- Pediatrics (Medical and Therapeutic)
- Issues relating to early Childhood (Nutrition, Physical Health, Development of senses etc.)
- Research in the areas of Children's Literature, teen literature and Children's Films
- Pedagogy related to every levels of education
- Issues relating to early stages of growth: Physical, Psychological, Spiritual etc.
- Research in education of the infant
- Research in Toddler's or Kindergarten education
- Research in primary Education: Formal, Non Formal, Informal
- Research for the development of new curriculum
- Research in simple handling of materials object, simple Crafts
- Introduction to agriculture, floriculture, horticulture
- Research in the field of multilingual skills
- Research pertaining to psychological measurement
- Research for new techniques for measurement and evaluation
- Scientific Experiments (Including Demonstrations & Explorations leading to Research in Yoga and Meditation
- Research in the area of Science of Living (Search for the highest aim of life);
- Research in the area of Science and Art of Learning;
- Research in Different aspects of Physical Education.

The Research Council

• There shall be a set up under the control of the Centre of Research, various councils for research as may be necessary, for research in the various subjects on

child related knowledge and child psychology, philosophy, children's literature and films and the subjects of similar nature.

- Each Research Council shall consist of the Vice-Chancellor as its Chairman, the Director General as its Vice-Chairman and the Director who shall be of the rank of the professor and shall act as the Member-Secretary.
- Each Research Council shall consist of four Scholars nominated by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Member-Secretary and the Dean of the centre of research and approved by the Academic Council.
- The Scholars shall be eminent educationists in the subject for whom the council is constituted and their role shall be to bring to the council their expert advice so as to promote research work of the council.
- For research in the research councils as also in the departments of research, there shall be a provision of fellowships which shall consist of not more than twenty-five fellows.

The various Councils of Research that may govern under the Centre shall be as follows:

- (i) Synthesis of the child-related knowledge-systems (Physical and medical)
- (ii) Synthesis of child-related knowledge-systems (Psychological and Cultural)
- (iii)Children's philosophy; child psychology, children's science, children's technology
- (iv) Child rights, human rights, fundamental duties, ideals of human unity and Futuristic visions
- (v) Gifted children; physically 'and mentally challenged children
- (vi) National and international education
- (vii) Multi-linguistic abilities in Indian and international languages
- (viii) Children's literature and films
- (ix) Development of integral personality

Departments Functioning Under the Center of Research

1. Department of Research in Prenatal Care & Education

Prenatal education is the part of Indian tradition of Eugenics. It is necessary that the education of a child's excellence begins from its conception and continues all through the life. During pregnancy the child is affected by the physical, psychological and spiritual well-being of the mother. We need to authenticate this knowledge through a series of researches. The University has taken initiative with the help of a twodimensional concept of prenatal research centre. These two dimensions are:

- (1) Researches in the domain of ancient Indian Eugenics, and
- (2) Guidance and education of pregnant mothers about prenatal and neonatal care.

Concept of Prenatal Research Department (Tapovan Research Center)

Prenatal research department has initiated various Tapovan Research centres across the state. The major objectives of these centers are as follows :

- To undertake researches in Indian eugenics.
- To educate pregnant women during pregnancy in terms of holistic wellbeing ;
- To study various phases of pregnancy in relation to GarbhVidhya.
- To study the role of family and society as a whole in healthy child.
- To study effect of the best Practices described in Garbh-samskar and Garbh-vijnan in the context of present era.
- To suggest best practices of prenatal care derived from various researches conducted under the department.
- To study the developmental phases of a child in the womb
- To study physiological, psychological and affective changes occurred during pregnancy and its impact on fetus.
- To study various global traditions of eugenics and to undertake comparative study of their frame work.

Programmes to realize our goals

For the actualization of afore mentioned objectives the university has developed first stage prenatal care and education model as a working pattern for various Tapovan Research Centers by the department.

- Personal sessions and workshops for group Counselling for child expecting couples.
- Every day sessions of prenatal care and education
- Sessions for neonatal care
- Psychological and physical measurement of mother during pregnancy
- Sessions on guidance about food and nutrition for prenatal phase
- Sessions of music, drawing, other arts and mathematic
- Sessions for emotional development and value inculcation through reading, storytelling and other group activities
- Sessions for spiritual development through prayer, meditation and spiritual discourses.

Research-Oriented Approach

- Creation of research based processes and knowledge through Scientific experimentations related to established Indian thinking on eugenics;
- Application of latest national & international researches in the treatment and counseling of pregnant mothers;
- Comparative study of health, behavior, and cognitive-affective development of Tapovan children with other children;
- To study the effectiveness of the Kangaroo method.

CENTER OF EDUCATION:

Children's University has divided its work in four different aspects, i.e Research, Education, Training and Extension. Education center mainly concerned with running education courses and developing educational resources for children. The university is to conduct number of educational programmes for the students engaged in research for M.Phil., Ph.D. and other Doctoral programme related to child education.

In addition, the University will undertake, organize and conduct different course for the purpose of teachers' training who are to be engaged in the work of teaching in affiliated, recognized and approved schools as also in Anganwadis and to provide to them not only a general kind of but specific programme of introduction to philosophy of children's university and to the philosophy of child-centered holistic education, and also of an elementary course related to the lessons of history, with special reference to Indian culture, its underlying spirituality, robust intellectually and inexhaustible vitality.

One of the importance functions of the Children's University will be related to Education. The University has several target groups. For the education of these groups the university will run various certificate, diploma, PG diploma graduation and post graduation and doctoral courses.

The target group of centre of education is ranging from prenatal to adulthood. For the holistic development of children of various age groups the centre will establish relationship with various institutions like Shishu Vatikas, Bal Mandirs, Anganwadis and primary and secondary schools. Further the university will also focus on the development of model institutes working at various stages from pre primary to higher education. These Schools in the campus will be known as Vidyaniketan, - the name chosen unanimously by the Task-Force. These institutes undertake various experiments related to teaching learning process, evaluation, curriculum design, material production and Panch Koshatmak Development of learner. The results of such experiments will be disseminated to the schools of Gujarat State.

It is expected that student's education in Vidyaniketan schools will bear a high quality of excellence, and the system as a whole will need to be enthused to receive the lessons of the educational work conducted at Vidyaniketan Schools.

The specialized courses will provide courses to specialization in following areas:

Nutrition, physical health and development of tender faculties of early childhood;

New pathways in the education of the infant / kindergarten / Anganwadis;

New pathways in primary education / secondary education / higher secondary education;

Computer-aided programmes at various stages of learning, devoted to self-learning, autocorrections and learning to do;

New pathways in pedagogy for fine arts/crafts/vocation, courses/physical education/ NSS or NCC or Scout and Guide / development of hobbies / puppetry / Children's drama / Children's poetry/children's stories/ children's music / children's dance / emerging new avenues of children's development.

The third target group of the education programme of the Children's University could be centered on social education programmes for parents, social workers, educationists, etc.

There programmes of education could be of short duration or long duration, and these programmes will provide introduction to the following:

- i. The need for pre-natal care and education of the parents;
- ii. Philosophy of social importance of the child;
- iii. Psychology of child development;
- iv. Philosophy for children;
- v. Stories and songs for children;
- vi. Aims of education and concept of excellence;
- vii. The aims of life;
- viii. Children's health, strength and physical excellence;
- ix. Science of self-knowledge and self-control;
- x. Extension services for the children in the society;
- xi. Philosophy of social and public service;
- xii. Lessons of history of Indian culture;
- xiii. Lessons of world history.

Another target group of the education programme of the Children's University will be research students who will be registered in the University for M.Phil/Ph.D. and doctoral programmes relating to child education.

Students will be registered in the University for conducting their research themes under the guidance and supervision of the members of the research and teaching staff of the University.

Finally, one of the target groups of the education programme of the Children's University will be candidates who wish to be qualified to serve as Anganwadi workers. They could be given suitable elementary programmes of studies connected with the following:

- i. Problems of early childhood;
- ii. Pedagogy of physical, psychological and spiritual growth of the child;
- iii. Activities and games for children in Anganwadis;
- iv. Stories and songs for children;
- v. Rhythmic and early lessons in singing and recitations;
- vi. Hygiene and beauty of the environment;
- vii. Flora and fauna of the local neighborhood;
- viii. Philosophy of an ideal Anganwadi teacher.

Innovative Syllabus and Material Development

Innovative curriculum development and teaching learning material production to support the wholesome development of a learner also falls under this dimension of the university. This feature will be the unique contribution to the field of education. The university will develop the series of syllabus which would help the learners to discover their inner abilities. The prime aim of the university is to develop children as good human being and not merely a self-centered person without any sense of values and duties. To bring this paradigm shift in the current education system this kind of life oriented syllabus will play very pivotal role. In this connection the university will develop the curricula namely 'AAVISKAR' and many others under varied titles.

Schema of Aaviskar Curriculum Series:

Aaviskar, the series of syllabus in the form of textual format aiming to nurture the holistic development of child, is one of the ambitious projects of the university. '*Aaviskar*' will be executed through experimental schools known as '*Vidyaniketans*'. The school teachers will be provided induction training to implement the course. This learner will be engaged for approximately 50 hours extra teaching – learning experiences. It will cultivate roots of *Bhartiya* thinking in the young minds. It focuses on '*Panchkoshatmak*' development of the child i.e., physical, vital, mental, scientific and spiritual aspects. It will focus on the development and enhancement of the different types of mental abilities of child related creativity, curiosity, inquisitiveness, critical thinking, problem solving, comprehension etc. *Aaviskar* will provide experiences to learner for self evaluation, self awareness, self regularization and social responsibility. This course will design in such a way that can nurture intellectual, emotional and psychomotor aspects of children. This series will cover students from standard 6 to 12. In the first stage the syllabus for standard 6, 7 and 8 will be developed. In the second stage the whole series will take place.

Integrated Learning material of CU

Yaspal Committee recommended learning without burden has not been followed by any institute in full fledge. An integrated learning is the step toward recommendation of Dr. Yaspal committee and our former education minister Dr. Vasuben Trivedi. An integrated Learning Material is described as one that interlinks different areas of study by cutting across subject-matter lines and emphasizing unifying concepts. Integration focuses on making connections for students, allowing them to engage in relevant, meaningful activities that can be connected to real life. It is proved in deferent studies that during teaching of integrated material students showed higher signs of retention at an increased rate than when an integrated material was not implemented.

Components of Integrated Curriculum

- Focuses on basic skills, content and higher level thinking
- Encourages lifelong learning
- Structures learning around themes, big ideas and meaningful concepts
- Provides connections among various curricular disciplines
- Provides learners opportunities to apply skills they have learned
- Encourages active participation in relevant real-life experiences
- Captivates, motivates, and challenges learners
- Provides a deeper understanding of content
- Offers opportunities for more small group and industrialized instruction

• Accommodates a variety of learning styles/theories (i.e., social learning theory, cooperative learning, intrinsic motivation, and self-efficacy) and multiple intelligences

During this academic year Center of Education of Children's University developed integrated material for standard 1 to 5. Many workshops were organized for the development of the Integrated material. Research based implementation has been done for critical analysis of the material and to know the effect of integrated material on the development of children. On the bases of research findings some changes has been done and material has been revised.

Integrated learning material includes activities which are challenging, fun orientated and meaningful that help students to connect with information and generate knowledge. This material works as scaffolding material for development of thinking skills of the students. When providing learning activities of integrated material students were able to relate things more closely and increase their experiences of real world.



School Accreditation Program of Children's University

The university aspires to be the best accreditation institute, which will help schools of Gujarat for holistic development of their learners and entire school community. Quality is not an act, it is a habit. Our accreditation system is not onetime process but it is continuous process including evaluation, reforms and enhancement of quality. As a part of accreditation program the first school namely Shri. K. J. Thakkar Bal Vidya Mandir has been accredited and awarded 'A' grade.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The aim of our curriculum is to promote academic excellence and provide opportunities for the holistic development. The learner centric teaching learning activities like workshops, seminars and field works are the part of our curriculum. We adopt new pedagogy like ICT based teaching, team teaching, blended learning, cooperative learning, project based learning etc. to stand with the current trends and innovations. We believe in preparing the perfect person who can cope up with the current needs. English is the current need of the day. Our foundation course gives our students an extra edge to improve communication skills in English. Other need based courses are also introduced as foundation or elective courses like data analysis, innovations in education, counseling etc..

Main focus of our curriculum is the holistic development of students. Thrust areas of our curriculum development are

- Strong foundation of *Bhartiya* Thinking
- Blended mode of ancient and Modern trends
- Holistic development of a human from childhood to adulthood
- Integration of modern technology in curriculum transaction
- Wellbeing of Child

To enrich the development of students we include *Bharatiya* Philosophy, Child psychology and research skills etc. as part of our curriculum. Children's University is committed for the development of every child right from one's mother's womb to one's full teen age. Curriculum includes topics like prenatal and postnatal education, early child care and education, toddlers and infants' education. Apart from this, the University has developed courses for other stakeholders too. There courses are for parents, teachers and other educationalists well. During the current academic year under the guidelines of the Centre of Education, the development of various new courses is in progress that will provide employment to the various stakeholders. The Center of Education is always active in organizing co-curricular activities, celebrating national and cultural festivals and days and fostering engagement of its students for their participation in several local, regional and national level competitions to provide them opportunities for overall development according to their skills, interest and aptitude.

Preparation of M.Phil. and Ph.D. Course ordinances

The Children's University has planned to initiate child centred higher education programs. In this direction in the first phase the university intends to start Research courses such as M.Phil. and Ph.D.. For smooth functioning of these courses the university

has prepared ordinance on the basis of UGC guidelines. The faculties of the University are appointed in the committee established for this purpose. The committee has submitted first draft of ordinances for the consideration of executive council. The ordinances now came into force with the resolution of executive council.

Teaching Learning Strategy:

As per vision and mission of the Children's University, the center will provide various types of activities along with teaching learning process, for holistic development of students.

The students are mentally prepared for learning through orientation before the actual commencement of teaching programme. We provide democratic environment during all teaching learning activities. Student centric approach is the part of our curriculum. We include seminar, workshop, group discussion, quiz, panel discussion, assignment, field work etc. for curriculum transaction. Along with these we give opportunity to every student for the participation in National or International seminars. Three above mentioned modes of curriculum transaction provides uniqueness. Our knowledgeable faculties justify all the theoretical courses as well as practical segments of the curriculum. Our faculty members use ICT and other technological tools during their day to day teaching to provide global and latest learning experiences to our students. We provide experiences of communication skills and other skills through our foundation courses. Latest technology is made available in each classroom. This includes mounted L.C.D. Projector, High Speed Internet, Laptops and so on. The University has an Air Conditioned Computer Laboratory (DELL) with dedicated fiber optic high speed Wi-Fi internet facility. The Spacious laboratory enables students along with the instructor to work properly and attentively. The latest computers will be arranged in a LAN after having all necessary software and learning resources like dictionary, research software like SPSS, Open stat, R and digital encyclopaedia.

The library is kept open from 10.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. and more than 20000 books are available in the Library. It shall be developed further to match the need of the modern time. The reference books for competitive exams like SET/NET, GPSC and other exams are also available in the library. The library also contains offline resources. The staff and student along with the teachers use the offline resources like educational CDs, encyclopedia, dictionaries etc. The library has collection of M.Ed./M.Phil. as well as Ph.D. dissertations. There is a high speed fiber optic internet connection given in the library. Wi-Fi internet is also made available at the library. A separate reading room arrangement is made. By this way library helps active learning. We will develop e corner for online surfing. The University will purchase many audio books, e books and jstor facility in the next five years.

Brief Introduction to the Center of Training:

The Children's University has four centers under which various departments shall be formed gradually. The Center of Training has a very pivotal role to transform vision of the University into practice. The Center of Training is intended to provide training to various stakeholders like teachers, students, principals, parents, community workers and policy makers etc. The ambit of Children's University is the development of every child from prenatal stage to adulthood. The main focus of the center is to offer unique training programs that may help to gear up the systematic transformation of education of the state at all level of education. This center of the university is working on and for the designing and planning of various training programs which are different in their nature and transaction. - To develop interest in extra or special activity.
- To make students aware of the importance of books' friendship.
- To introduce students about Gujarati and Indian life style through poems, rhymes, story, drama and film etc.
- To provide information and guidance regarding the development of physical, mental and spiritual aspects of the students.

Extension Services related to Prenatal care and Education:

Prenatal Extension services have been put into place to impart training to pregnant women in interior villages.

Pre-natal care and education:

- To mobilize the pregnant women and to provide them prenatal and postnatal care education and counselling.
- To counsel their family members for holistic development of child
- To counsel pregnant women on birth preparedness, importance of safe delivery, breastfeeding and complementary feeding, immunization, contraception and prevention of common infections including Reproductive Tract Infection/Sexually Transmitted Infection (RTIs/STIs) and care of the young child.
- The extension centre for prenatal care and education works for 3 hours daily.
