Role Play Activity for students On Adolescent Education in Children's University dated 16/02/2023

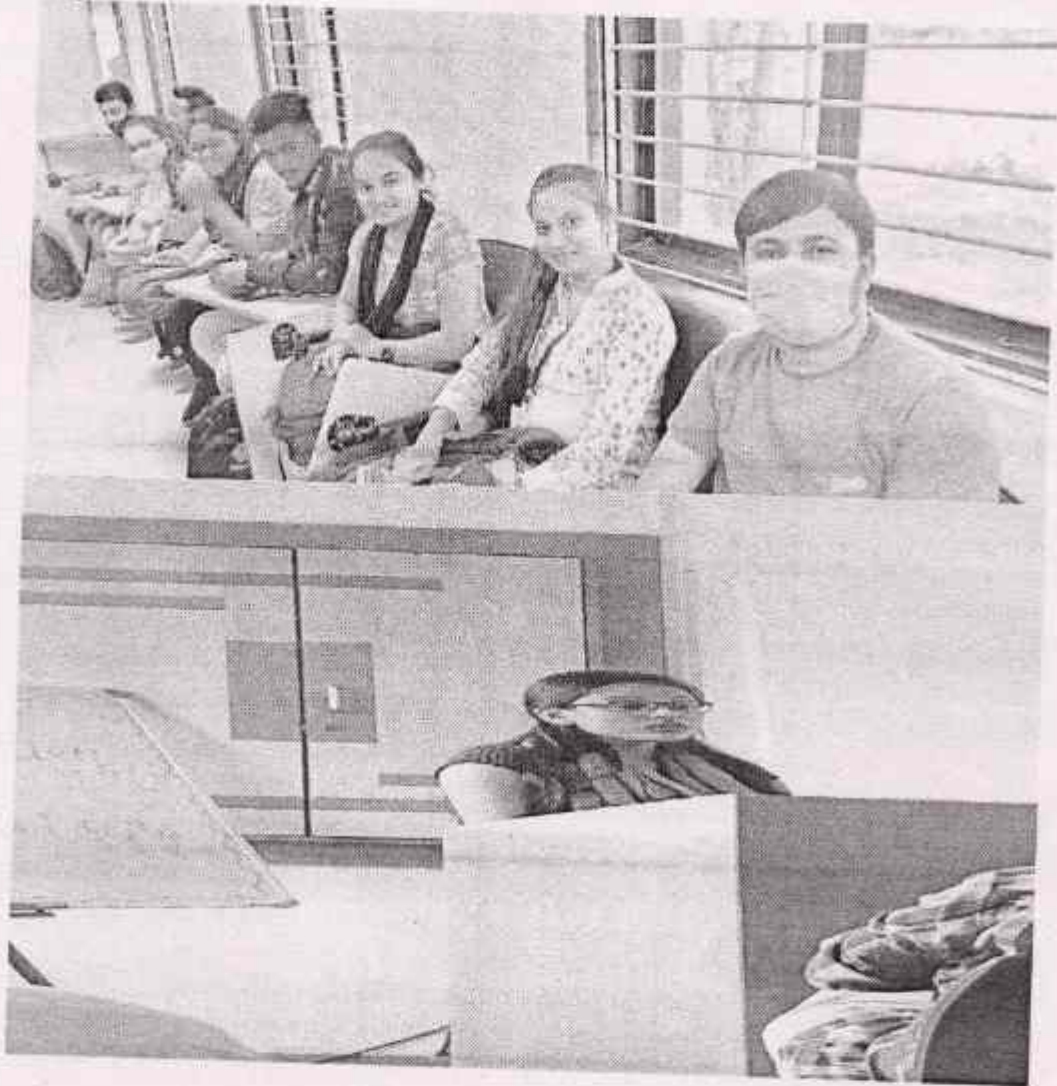
