2. Department of Shishuparamarshan

After the birth of the child, parents and families can take full care of the child, get guidance on all aspects of child development, and take appropriate decisions regarding various dilemmas related to childcare. The "Shishu Paramarshan Department" is functioning in Children's University.

Another objective of Shishu Paramarshan is to assist children and their mothers or family members in coping with various challenges and difficulties they may encounter during children's formative years. These challenges can include family conflicts, peer relationships, emotional issues, behavioral problems, and other developmental concerns. counselors work collaboratively with children, their parents or guardians. Shishu Paramarshan typically involves creating a safe and confidential environment for child and mother both. The role of a counselor is multifaceted. They work closely with parents or guardians, providing guidance on effective parenting strategies and creating a supportive home environment for the child's well-being.

Total 15 faculties of the university recognized as Ph.D. guide were engaged in the year 2022-23 and more 32 faculties were recognized as Ph.D. guide to supervise the newly admitted Ph.D. students. The progress of the is periodically assed by RAC and RDC members.

Centre of Training

Introduction:

The Children's University has four centers in which various departments will be established gradually. The Center of Training has a very pivotal role to transform the vision of the university into practice. The Center of Training is intended to provide training to various stakeholders like teachers, students, principals, parents, community workers and policy makers etc. The aim of Children's University is development of child from prenatal stage to adulthood. The main focus of the center is to provide a unique kind of training which can help the systematic transformation of education of the state at all levels. The center of Training is contributing to various initiatives of the university by providing training in various modes. Presently, the Center of Training is working on training in the area of school education and prenatal care and education. Center of training of the university is working on designing and planning of various training programs which are different in their nature and transaction. The very design of the university system as suggested in the act is to provide room for working in collaboration with all centers of the university. This provides a strong base of research and education to the center of training on which all training subjects and methodologies will be laid down.

Objectives :

- To create in the University campus as also elsewhere, schools to be called Vidyaniketan Schools for various stages of education which will embody and crystallize the results of the research conducted by the University or elsewhere, and to spread benefits of the work of these schools to the entire system of education in the State, and to provide training to teachers and prepare teaching learning materials for this purpose for the benefit of the schools in the campus and also other schools in the State;
- To undertake, organize and conduct programmes for the purposes of teacher's training who shall be engaged in the work of teaching in the Vidyaniketan Schools and in affiliated, recognized and approved schools, and to provide them, a general programme of introduction to philosophy of children's University and to the philosophy of child centered holistic education, as also elementary course related to the lessons of history, with special reference to Indian culture, its underlying spirituality, robust intellectuality and inexhaustible vitality as also to provide for the following:

 - (ii) New pathways in educational programmes, related to different stages of education such as infant, kindergarten, Aanganwadis, primary education, secondary education;
 - (iii) New pathways in the pedagogy of fine arts, crafts, vocational courses, physical education, development of hobbies, puppetry, children's drama, children's poetry, children's stories, children's music, children's dance, emerging new avenues of children's development, etc.;
 - (iv) In-service training programmes for candidates who wish to qualify to serve as anganwadi workers; to establish teachers' education and training institutions of innovative education and to provide for education and training for implementation of the educational innovations;
- To provide for instruction, extension, teaching and training in such branches or learning and course of study as the University may, from time to time, determine;

Functions of Center :

- To undertake training programs for various stakeholders as suggested in the CUAct, 2009.
- To create and develop various training and educational material for the effective teaching learning of the students and teachers.
- To support the education department of the state for effective organization of the training programs for various levels of the education system.
- To create an environment and ecology for the holistic development of the learners of the whole state in the field of art, culture and values.

1. Department of GEET

Introduction :

Children's University, Gandhinagar is a sartorial state university situated at Gandhinagar Gujarat. The university was established way back in the year 2009 to cater to the needs of the society.
